## 2015

- April 7, 2015 – at the Waialua Community Association for the Waialua community;
- May 6, 2015 – at the FilCom Center as part of the Filipino community’s “Flores de Mayo” celebration;
- May 22, 2015 – at the Hawaii State Capitol as part of the historic “Sakada Day” bill signing ceremonial reception before community leaders and a living Sakadas, establishing December 20<sup>th</sup> of each year as “Sakada Day” in Hawaii.
- \* August 11, 2015 – at the Philippine Consulate General in NYC as part of their summer movie series, sharing the Sakada story with a broad NYC audience and Filipino community, who were largely unaware of these stories and who embraced this piece of Filipino-American history in Hawaii. The Q&A with filmmaker, Maribel Apuya, added to the depth of connection and dialogue as she personally shared the historical and cultural significance of the Sakadas;
- \* August 14 & 15, 2015 – at the ‘Ohina Short Film Showcase among the best of Hawaii’s short films held at the Honolulu Museum of Art Doris Duke Theatre;
- October 31, 2015 – at the Bayanihan Gala, FilCom Center’s annual fundraiser, themed “Celebrating our plantation legacy” held at the Sheraton Waikiki;
- \* November 16, 21, and 22, 2015 – at the Hawaii International Film Festival (HIFF) as part of *Made in Hawaii Shorts*, which screened to a large audience at the Regal Dole Cannery IMAX Theater and to a sold out crowd at Koko Marina theater.

## 2016

- \* January 1-4, 2016 – at the Waimea Ocean Film Festival in the Big Island. Screening locations: The Fairmont Orchid Hotel, Four Seasons Resort Hualalai, Kahilu Theater, Parker School Theater and the Hawaii Preparatory Academy (HPA) Gates Performing Arts Center;
